Uruguay strongly protects the author's rights (copyright) based in a low flexible system, hardened after signing the WTO and WIPO agreements. This system reflects, in a sense, the wish to be taken out of the "black lists", making the international reputation of the country better.

This model emphasizes the public interest over individual's, specially in education, art and culture, and it is possible thanks to the Creative Commons licenses.
